


Saxon Wood School

Dear Parents and Carers,





School has been full of excitement this week: On Monday after school, we decorated the school for our Halloween day on Tuesday. It looked wonderful.

A big thank you to staff for decorating the school so well. And another big thank you to Antonio who came in really early the next morning (6am!!) to put all the decorations away.

Amy and I had had a lot of fun collecting 50 pumpkins from the shop. We certainly did raise an eyebrow or two!

The children and staff had a wonderful day. Each child took part in games, cooking and art then they all had their very own pumpkin to take home.

Their costumes were wonderful, so a big thank you for providing those and supporting us.

I have enjoyed my learning walks this week and I had the privilege of being joined by Alan Rowden, our chair of governors. Each class always brings a huge smile to our faces when we visit them.



This week Squirrel Class have enjoyed learning all about Halloween and Bonfire night. We have been busy making decorations for the Halloween ball and then enjoyed coming together with the whole school on Tuesday. The children really enjoyed spending time with some of the older children. In maths we have been learning about heavy and light using real life objects found in our classroom. We have been using the scales to compare and observe what a 'heavy' object does and what a 'light' object does when they are placed on the scales together.

In literacy our key text has been 'Sparks in the Sky' as we learn all about bonfire night and how to enjoy this day whilst keeping ourselves safe and in phonics we have been looking at the 's' sound, listening out for it in words, finding objects around the classroom that start with 's' and making the grapheme with our pointy finger in the air and in sensory trays. Can you find any objects around the home that start with the 's' sound?

In Rabbit class we have been settling back into the routine of our day. We have had a great time exploring different activities using the Halloween theme. In expressive art we have made spooky ghosts, printing painting pumpkins and making chocolate apples. We have enjoyed our music sessions and loved moving our bodies to the music in Move Momentum. In bucket time with have revealed scary ghosts, big pumpkins, spooky bats and looking at glow in the dark happy and sad ghosts. We have also enjoyed our phonic and maths song.

During this half term our topic is 'Celebrations' could you please provide us with some photos of the children celebrating any events that are special to them and your family. You can either send these in for me to copy and return back to you, or you can send them via email to the admin team.

As it is now getting colder could you please provide the children with warm coats, hats, scarves and gloves due to children exploring and accessing some great educational moments outside. Can we also ask if you could provide the children with a spare set of clothes.



Hedgehog class have started work on their new topic of Space. They have practised their handwriting and have been learning the 'ea' sound in phonics. In maths we have looked at place value using dines. This week we have also been very busy with lots of craft activities for Halloween where we made some delicious biscuits and carved pumpkins. Today we have done some fabulous firework painting and made sparklers out of breadsticks, chocolate and sprinkles!



Badger class have done some super learning this week. In literacy we are getting to know the story 'Whatever next' by Jill Murphy. In maths our new topic is place value and we have shown how great we are at ordering numbers. The children very much enjoyed our super Halloween party and activities including decorating our pumpkin biscuits and carving our own pumpkin to take home. Today we are preparing for firework night by making edible fireworks using chocolate, sprinkles and breadsticks together with making some explosive firework pictures.



This week Dormouse Class have enjoyed exploring all things Halloween and Bonfire Night! We have enjoyed a sensory story of Room on the Broom and loved investigating all the different characters it featured! We then made our own exploding miniature pumpkins by filling them with sparkly bicarbonate of soda, dyed vinegar and glitter! We used amazing combined fine and gross motor skills to bench sit and stand to explore slimy green spaghetti and giant marshmallow ghosts! Children showed real interest feeling all the different properties of then painting our own pumpkins and even rolled conkers around in paint to create our own design! Another favourite was pumpkin bowling, rolling a pumpkin down the half pipe to try and knock down as many skittles as we could. The children listened carefully, waiting to hear "Ready, Steady, Go!" before pushing their pumpkin. They carefully touched each skittle as it was counted too!

Lots of anticipation skills have been worked on, the mathematical concepts of "more", "in" and "out" and some amazing motor skills as well as some fabulous communication, exploratory and most importantly play skills!

The children all looked incredible in their costumes - thank you to all of you for your efforts!!!

Teachers and support staff will <u>not</u> respond to direct emails from parents




Friday 10th November Superheroes dress up day
