Saxon Wood in action!



Fox class have continued with their topic, 'At the farm.' Reading the story of, 'The little Red Hen' and practising their number songs to five. They have been busy making animals using different materials such as cotton wool, tissue paper and feathers whilst listening to and making lots of different animal sound effects. They have continued to practise catching and throwing balls and had a super dance session with Move Momentum.



Badger class have continued to explore instructions and their purpose. We are very much looking forward to making our own potions next week which we will then create a set of instructions for so others can make it too! In PE, some children have been exploring different ways to travel around an area such as side stepping and lunging. Others have been continuing to work hard on their physio programmes and have shown great resilience. In maths, we have been working on subitising numbers 1-5. We are getting good at recognising the numbers represented on a dice without counting the dots! Badger class have continued to practise sounding and blending words in phonics and reading. Some of us had a go at thinking about how we can use our voices to read with expression to make our reading even more exciting!



This week in Squirrel class the children enjoyed many farmyard related activities. They continued getting to know the characters in our story and recognising their emotions. They also further practiced recognising the sounds of different farm animals during phonics activities and practiced counting and number names up to 5 through topic related number songs. The children found great fun in painting and crafting a paper plate pig and joining in with animal splash in Bucket time. In PE everyone is trying their best working on their physical skills and in music they are joining in with playing on different instruments with and without support.



Hedgehog class this week have been working on phonic sounds 'ue' U-Hoo, 'ue' Cool Blue and 'ew' Cool Blue. They have been playing various games like Pin the grapheme, the first 'ue' standing and Teacher say's, a phonics version of Simon says. The high frequency words they have learnt this week are: they, are, ask, put, and, the. Some of the children have started spelling too. In Maths we have been looking at representing numbers. Showing different ways to represent a number, counting and recognising that number and moving on to number bonds using that number. In Literacy we have read 'Spindrella' and looked at before reading, during reading and after reading questions to help with our comprehension. We have also been working on adjectives to help describe a character's qualities. In PE some children are making some great progress in their physio, while others have been looking at movement and using their bodies to move in a controlled way by being astronauts.



Dormouse Class have been working really, really hard on their motor skills practising locating, exploring and holding a range of textured resources. As they were all the same colour and shape this really helped us centre our attention on the textures of the objects. Crepe paper was a definite hit! Some children even tried picking up and transferring them to card to create a wonderful jungle tree trunk scene!


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
